

## REMARKS OF AMB. TEODORO L. LOCSIN, JR. AT THE PHILIPPINE EMBASSY LONDON'S RIZAL DAY 2024 COMMEMORATION

Knights and ladies of Rizal, Ladies and Gentlemen,

We gather this afternoon to commemorate the 128th anniversary of the martyrdom of our national hero, Dr. Jose Rizal.

We gather not only to remember his life and sacrifice but also to reflect on the ideals he lived and died for — a legacy that continues to inspire generations of Filipinos in the Philippines and around the world.

In his lifetime, Jose Rizal was a doctor, writer, and the First Filipino. He valued education, justice, and the dignity of every human being regardless of differences of race and nationality. He saw the human in every human being before anything else. Hence the universality of his writings. To be sure, his writings and actions inspired the rise of a nation distinctly itself — not from a sharp and discriminating sense of difference, but from a desire for all of the good things in life: freedom, dignity, well being; being no one's servant nor anyone's master for that matter; finally at home in a place they could call their own. Not to exclude strangers but to warmly welcome them to experience Filipino hospitality. The result was a brave struggle for independence after centuries of foreign rule from distant Madrid via Mexico at that. A rule comparatively mild to be sure; as it tended to be under a Catholic colonial master ruling a Catholic people. Their souls and those of their political masters were the same in the eyes of their common God — even if their social and political conditions were not. But it was all under heaven, in an empire on which the sun never set, ruled from the Escorial in Spain by kings as distant from Spaniards as they were from their Filipino subjects.

As we extol his brave death, we honor his life of accomplishments worthy of the best of mankind; it erased any prejudice against the capabilities of our race.

Wherever in the world Filipinos live, work and add to the betterment of all without distinction, we carry the spirit of Dr. Rizal. Whether here in the UK or elsewhere, Rizal's lived ideals exemplified by his bravery and integrity, of skill in the service of humankind, guide us as we build wider bridges of understanding; and stronger ties between the Philippines and the world. We are universalists.

Jose Rizal believed deeply in the potential of the Filipino people. But he knew that the path to the freedom we wanted could not, indeed should not be taken through violence that widens division and hatred that forges differences like steel through fire. Rather a more encompassing and far superior freedom achieved through a liberal education, enlightenment, compassion for everyone in need of it; and a love of country untainted by ignorant hatred of others. He said, "The youth is the hope of our future." That sounds trite. Where else can hope come but from youth to carry on the struggles of your old age and mine; and thereby achieve our mission of a better country in a better world. And never at the expense of others. This timeless sentiment remains relevant. Progress — whether of nation or individual — is rooted in the nurturing of minds, the cultivation of compassion, and a resolute belief in a brighter future — not just for us but for all.
